We ask this through Christ who is the Light of the World. Amen.






Prayer of Confession



Advent Profession of Faith - Adapted from the Belgic Confession, Article 18 & 26

What do we profess to believe concerning the coming of Christ Jesus?

We confess that God fulfilled the promise made, by the mouth of the holy prophets, when God sent the only and eternal Son of God into the world at the time appointed.

We believe that we have no access to God except through the one and only Mediator and Intercessor, Jesus Christ the righteous, who was made human, uniting together the divine and human natures, so that we human beings might have access to the divine Majesty. But this Mediator, whom the Father has appointed, ought not terrify us by his greatness. For neither in heaven nor among the creatures of earth is there anyone who loves us more than Jesus Christ.

Although he was in the form of God, Christ nevertheless emptied himself, taking human form and the form of a slave for us, and he made himself like his brothers and sisters in every respect. In this way, Christ is truly our Immanuel, that is, God with us.

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name.
